### 2. Project Objectives

To support the emergency response in targeted refugee camps in the Horn of Africa by expanding implementation of a health and nutrition package of services in targeted refugee camps, in a manner consistent with the sub-region's medium term human development goals.

### 3. Project Description

The project consists of the following components:

- (a) Component 1: Treatment and prevention of malnutrition and provision of basic health services, including the screening of beneficiaries
  - (i) Component 1a: Treatment and prevention of malnutrition among vulnerable populations, particularly children and women. This component will address the prevention and treatment of acute malnutrition among children, in addition to focusing on the nutritional needs of pregnant and lactating women.
  - (ii) Component 1b: Provision of basic health services. This component will focus on maternal and child health services, in addition to the prevention and treatment of common sources of morbidity and mortality, including respiratory tract infections, diarrheal disease, and malaria.
  - (iii) Component 1c: Strengthening of sanitation facilities and safe water supply as key contributors to improved health status. This component will enable the provision of improved water and sanitation facilities in the targeted areas.

- (b) Component 2: Project Management. Project management will include overall coordination of the operation, in addition to M&E activities (including the innovative use of ICT technology to facilitate data collection, monitoring, and management).

## II. Key Safeguard Policy Issues and Their Management

### A. Summary of Key Safeguard Issues

<p><b>1. Describe any safeguard issues and impacts associated with the proposed project. Identify and describe any potential large scale, significant and/or irreversible impacts:</b></p> <p>The key safeguard issue for this planned operation involves health care medical waste management, given the project's focus on the provision of emergency health and nutrition services. However, no potential large scale, significant, or irreversible impacts are envisioned.</p> <p>However, given application of the United Nations Fiduciary Principles Accord (FPA) for this operation, World Bank safeguard policies do not apply. Rather, UNHCR's 2005 Environmental Guidelines apply in this instance and will be adopted for this operation according to UNHCR's standard project implementation mechanisms. The Guidelines call for the appointment of an Environmental Focal Point and the preparation of a rapid Environmental Assessment/Action Plan. UNHCR's Environmental Guidelines are broadly consistent with the Bank's Environmental, Health and Safety Guidelines for the water, sanitation and waste management interventions proposed under the operation. Medical waste is also a project risk and UNHCR's policies encompass management of medical waste generated during the life of a project.</p> <p>For World Bank records only, the project has been classified as a Category B operation and OP 4.01 is triggered. However, it is important to note that classification of the Project as Category B and triggering of OP 4.01 are solely for the purposes of signaling that had this operation been prepared as a standard Bank operation, not using the FPA instrument, that these elements would be appropriate for this type of operation and that relevant safeguard tools would have to be prepared. But, given the FPA and the fact that Bank policies do not apply in this instance, the Bank's safeguard policy requirements do not apply to this operation.</p>
<p><b>2. Describe any potential indirect and/or long term impacts due to anticipated future activities in the project area:</b></p> <p>Not applicable. In addition to medical waste management, the project would support only small-scale and site-specific rehabilitation of potable water supplies, in addition to possible rehabilitation and small-scale construction of waste management facilities, including latrines. All such activities would be site-specific and time limited, given the 18 month implementation period for this operation,</p>
<p><b>3. Describe any project alternatives (if relevant) considered to help avoid or minimize adverse impacts.</b></p> <p>Not applicable</p>
<p><b>4. Describe measures taken by the borrower to address safeguard policy issues. Provide an assessment of borrower capacity to plan and implement the measures described.</b></p> <p>UNHCR's 2005 Environmental Guidelines apply in this instance and will be adopted for this operation according to UNHCR's standard project implementation mechanisms. Specifically and for the World Bank record, the team has confirmed that UNCHR adopted Environmental Guidelines in 2005 which appear to have the status of policy for that agency. UNHCR also has a handbook for addressing environmental matters in its projects. Both documents have been filed in the operations WBdocs file for the record.</p>
<p><b>5. Identify the key stakeholders and describe the mechanisms for consultation and disclosure on safeguard policies, with an emphasis on potentially affected people.</b></p> <p>The key stakeholders will be those residing within and around the indicated refugee camps, Dadaab in Kenya and Dollo Ado in Ethiopia. The consultations and disclosures will be conducted by UNHCR following their 2005 Environmental Guidelines and according to their standard project implementation mechanisms. The World Bank has considered the environmental and social risks associated with this project and understands that there may be minor, site specific and time-bound rehabilitation of small civil works involved. It is also understood that all project activities in the water and sanitation sector will be at pre-existing facilities in the two refugee camps.</p>
