Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The Mid Term Review Mission took place from October 2-11, 2017. The Education Improvement Project (EIP) became effective on November 20, 2014. As of today, civil works have been successfully launched in all five high schools selected under the first batch for rehabilitation and seismic strengthening under the project. Current efforts are focused on finalizing the selection of schools and launching the tenders for the second batch of high schools. A total of 57 preschool education micro-projects have been launched as part of the project and are fully operational benefiting about 2,000 students. Twelve higher education institutions were awarded grants under the Competitive Innovation Fund (CIF) for higher education. The beneficiary institutions include also private higher education institutions in Armenia. During the Mid Term Review mission a discussion on a possible project restructuring was undertaken.



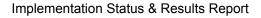

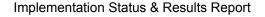

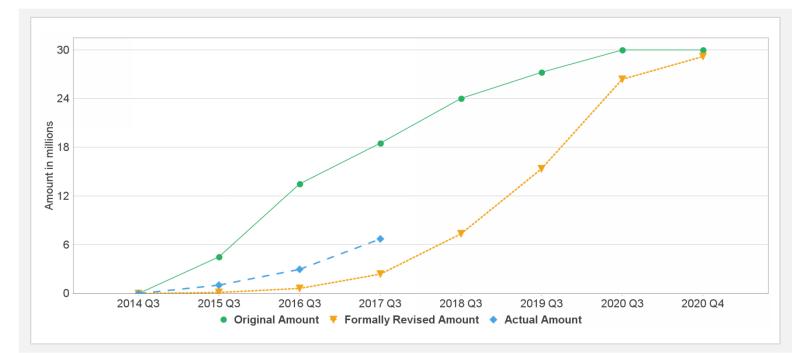
