

Implementation Status Overview

REGULATORY REGIME

SDNRP2 continues to assist the Ministry of Mines & Petroleum), the National Environmental Protection Agency (NEPA), and Ministry of Information & Culture (MoIC) to further



improve their capacities to effectively regulate Afghanistan's mineral resource development in a transparent and efficient manner. Key achievements include:

- (a) Award of Contracts and Licenses (i) continued support of a Secretariat within the Inter-Ministerial Committee (IMC) to be responsible for all tendering of mineral deposits; (ii) assistance from the International Advisory Panel (IAP) regarding competitive transparent tender processes; (iii) continued Aynak Contract Monitoring & Supervision into operational phase; (iv) ensuring preservation of cultural / antique artifacts at Mes Aynak through support to DAFA and UNESCO via Ministry of Information & Culture; and (v) continued licensing / cadastre modernization through up-to-date software and related training for staff
- (b) Advancing Geoscientific Knowledge completion of digitalization of geo data and development of a comprehensive and user-friendly geo-database; support for new field work to collect additional geological data in order to attract private sector exploration, support of a laboratory
- (c) Implementation of a Dynamic Inspection & Contract Compliance regime -- (i) Continue strengthening of monitoring and inspection capabilities, inspection services at MoMP and NEPA (ii) establishment of a Contract Compliance Office and follow up regarding the results of a second Strategic Environmental / Social Assessment SESA; (iii) Increase NEPA's capacity regarding preparation, implementation, and review of environmental/social impact assessments and environmental/social management plans; monitoring and enforcement of environmental and social requirements; and ensuring effective public consultation and community engagement; and (iii) Preparation of a Resettlement Policy Framework and grievance redress mechanism under Aynak Authority

EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRIES TRANSPARENCY INITIATIVE


For the Afghanistan EITI (AEITI), the Bank supports implementation through the Second Sustainable Development of Natural Resources Technical Assistance Project (SDNRP2), as well as the global EITI MDTF. The SDNRP2 funding is administered and channeled through the Ministry of Mines & Petroleum, whereas it is the AEITI National Secretariat which is housed in the Ministry of Finance that is the implementing agency for MDTF-related funds. Furthermore, the Bank has provided funds to directly support Civil Society Organizations (CSO) in Afghanistan, working closely with Revenue Watch and Integrity Watch and its various partners. Progress has been made in AEITI over the last couple years in terms of securing EITI Candidate Status, establishing the formal AEITI Multi Stakeholders Group with an adequate and active participation of all EITI stakeholders groups, and fully-staffed AEITI Secretariat to support and coordinate daily EITI activities such as various capacity building events, training, workshops, MSG meetings, media and outreach activities, etc.

The work related to the key EITI activities such as reconciliation processes and validation corrective measures have been initiated and are underway towards their full implementation in accordance with EITI action plan. The WB staffs including local consultants and the SDNRP Project Implementation Unit's staff have been closely engaged in providing the AEITI with procurement, financial management, advisory, and relevant administrative assistances over the implementation of various EITI activities as set out in the related procurement plans, general AEITI action plan, and other documents. The 1st and 2nd AEITI National reconciliation reports have been produced and widely discussed by AEITI stakeholders. Upon completion EITI Validation process in 2013 the EITI International Board agreed that Afghanistan had made meaningful progress in the EITI fulfilling 11 EITI requirements out of 21 in accordance with EITI Rules. In this regard its candidacy was extended for 18 months, until 10 October 2014 by which time it must have completed EITI validation that demonstrate compliance with the 2011 edition of EITI Rules. The work to address validation shortcomings has been already initiated and in February 2014, the MSG meeting had full participation of the partners, MSG members and the two Excellencies Minister of Finance and Minister of Mining and Petroleum. The meeting reported on several positive developments regarding: revised MSG ToR's, revised Country Work Plan, a Comprehensive Communications Strategy, and a new Website (aeiti.af). In addition in late March the A-EITI Secretariat met with EITI Global Secretariat counterparts in Oslo

ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL SAFEGUARDS/MES AYNAK

The MoMP and NEPA have made good progress on the finalization of the Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF) and associate Resettlement Policy Framework (RPF), the Aynak Resettlement Action Plan (RAP), and the Strategic Environmental and Social Assessment (SESA) for the sector. While the preparation of these documents marks a critical achievement towards ensuring that Afghanistan's mining sector contributes to the sustainable development of the country over the long-term; their preparation is however only a first step in this long-term trajectory. There is a need for the government to systematically prioritize and implement key recommendations to strengthen the documentation and transparency of processes / decisions around resettlement and compensation of Aynak project affected people. Weakening performance on safeguard compliance resulting from inadequate documentation and transparency of reporting is due to slow and faltering implementation of the Aynak Resettlement Action Plan, lack of observance of the policies and procedures set out in the RAP and the ESMF regarding documentation and reporting which includes decisions under the Grievance Redress Management system. To remedy this issue, the Bank has urged MoMP to immediately take action by: 1) Finalizing the procurement of the national social specialist; and 2) make greater use of independent Third Party monitoring of all processes and outcomes of acquisition/compensation/resettlement in Aynak; this activity is currently undertaken through the Aynak compliance monitoring contract with a major consultancy (GAF).

INVESTMENT CLIMATE




There continues to be investor interest in Afghanistan's oil, gas and mining sector. There has been good progress in the negotiations of a mineral development agreement for Hajigak iron ore, with the award of three of four blocks to an India consortium led by state-owned Steel Authority of India Ltd. (SAIL) and the award of the fourth block to a Canadian company, Kilogold. In recent month four new medium size mines (Balkhab Copper, Badakhshan Gold, Shaida Copper, Zarkashan Gold & Copper) were successfully tendered with support from the USG's Task Force for Business and Stability Operations (TFBSO). However, the finalization of negotiations of many of these mining contracts is expected to be delayed until passage of the new mining law which is in Parliament. On September 24, 2013, the Ministry of Mines and Petroleum (MOMP), with support from the Donors including the WB, invited several international experts to participate in a workshop aimed providing member s of the Afghanistan Parliament and staff with critical information about the country's mineral resources, details the process of responsible exploration and extraction in the mining sector, and international good practice on mining laws. Preparation of related environmental, social, health and safety, and licensing regulations aligned with the new law have been completed or are underway.







Disbursement Graph




Key Decisions Regarding Implementation

This ISR is based on discussions with the PMU, other relevant government counterparts, and project consultants as well as findings from the Mid-Term Review (MTR) of the project which took place from February - April 2014. The following key decisions have been reached with the Government during that period:

- Based on the findings of the mission, the Bank team in consultation with the MoMP recommends a restructuring of SDNRP2. The aim of the restructuring is to eliminate duplication with other donor funded activities that emerged during project implementation and to realign project to evolving government priorities in the sector.
- SDNRP2 will support further capacity building of CSO and the MGS under the EITI process, with a view to supporting AEITI reach candidacy status by Oct 2014.
- In an effort to build greater ownership of the site at a national level, the number of international archaeologists has been reduced over the last several months, which will be replaced by more national and regional archaeologists. In addition, UNESCO is being procured to provide sustained capacity-building to the Ministry of Information and Culture (MOIC), which will support the transition from a primarily internationally led effort to one with greater national support.
