Program Development Objectives

Program Development Objective (from Program-for-Results Appraisal Document)

This Operation provides support to the Swachh Bharat Mission – Gramin (SBM-G) national program, the new rural sanitation flagship program launched by the Prime Minister in September, 2014. The Program Development Objective of the Swachh Bharat Mission Support Operation (SBMSO) is to: to reduce open defecation in rural areas, and strengthen MDWS capacity to manage the national SBM-G program.

Implementation Status and Key Decisions

The Ministry of Drinking Water Supply and Sanitation (MDWS) is providing support in accelerating SBM-G implementation by States and districts to improve access of toilets, reduce open defecation and in achieving open defecation free (ODF) villages. It is commendable that two additional states- Himachal Pradesh and Kerala have recently been declared as ODF states, thus having a total of three state-wide ODF status in the country along with Sikkim. In addition it is worth noting that 60 districts (9 percent), 52,562 Gram Panchayats (GPs) (21 percent) and about 117,771 inhabited villages (19 percent) have self-declared ODF by Nov16. Household toilet construction has increased immensely from 5.8 million in FY14-15 to 12.7 million in FY15-16 and 9.2 million in this fiscal year so far.

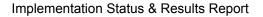
